



KNIK GOOSE BAY ROAD: VINE ROAD TO SETTLER'S BAY PROJECT

Project Background

This section of roadway has a mix of industrial, commercial, and residential uses and is identified by DOT&PF as a principal arterial, which means it is intended to provide higher mobility and lower access. In 2009, this roadway was designated by DOT&PF as a Traffic Safety Corridor due to a fatal accident rate that was 3.8 times the national average. This project will address these important safety concerns and make traveling easier and more efficient through the corridor.

Purpose

The purpose of this project is to improve safety, reduce congestion, and increase travel efficiency.

Need

- Reduce crash rates along the corridor.
- Reduce congestion for users and reduce delay at intersections.
- Decrease travel time for users commuting to the Parks Highway or major roads that lead to Anchorage.
- Safely and efficiently accommodate mobility for longer trips and accessibility to adjacent land and local streets.
